La Dottoressa Alison Bishop in Jolly, nasce a Ithaca, New York. È sposata a Richard Jolly dal 1963 e ha 4 figli.

La Dottoressa Alison Jolly ha conseguito la laurea in Zoologia alla Cornell University nel 1958 e successivamente il Dottorato di Ricerca in Zoologia alla Yale University nel 1962 con una tesi sulla evoluzione anatomo-funzionale delle mani dei primati.

Ha svolto diversi ruoli di spicco nella sua carriera: è stata Research Associate nella New York Zoological Society dal 1962 al 1964. Successivamente è stata per un anno, tra il 1966 e il 1967 Teaching Associate presso la University of Zambia e per l'anno successivo Research Associate alla Cambridge University. Dal 1971 al 1974 e dal 1978 al 1981 ha ricoperto il ruolo di Research Associate per la University of Sussex di cui è Visiting Scientist dal 2000 ad oggi. Tra il 1982 e il 1987 è stata Guest Investigator per la Rockefeller University e ha fatto parte dal 1982-97 del Board of Visitors del Centro primato primatologico più importante a livello internazionale, che è quello della Duke University. Successivamente, fino al 2000 Visiting Lecturer alla Princeton University. Fa parte della "American Academy of Arts and Sciences" e della "American Association for the advancement of science".

E' stata Presidente dal 1992 al 1996 della International Primatological Society
