In October 2015, the new workprogrammes and calls within the scope of Horizon 2020, the new EU Framework Programme for Research and Innovation, have been published. Between 2014 and 2020, a budget of approximately 70 billion Euros will be available for funding within Horizon 2020.

Impact and innovation are main criteria for successful proposals in Horizon 2020, where IP issues play a very important role. To inform potential applicants about the relevance of those aspects and how to emphasize them in their proposals, the University of Torino organizes a workshop in cooperation with the European IPR Helpdesk.
