



Who can apply?



The University of Torino guarantees access to the Erasmus+ programme to all students if they are regularly enrolled (including part-time) in a:

- undergraduate degree program;
- postgraduate degree program;
- 5/6 year postgraduate degree program;
- degree course "Vecchio ordinamento" (prior to Ministerial Decree 509/99);
- master's degree program of first and second level;
- doctorate;
- postgraduate course...

... if they wish to spend a **period abroad** during their academic career at a University that has signed a bilateral agreement with UniTo (1.642 interinstitutional agreements activated for a.y. 2025/2026, providing 5.326 available places!) considering that:

Studying in the UK





The UK government has announced that by April 2025, all visitors who do not require a visa will need to obtain an **Electronic Travel Authorisation (ETA)** to enter the United Kingdom:

- Non-European citizens can apply for the ETA starting from November 27, 2024, and will need it to enter the UK from January 8, 2025.
- European citizens can apply for it from March 5, 2025, and will need it to enter the UK from April 2, 2025.

The ETA will be obtained through a quick and simple application using the UK ETA app. The ETA costs £10 and allows multiple entries into the UK for a maximum period of six months every two years or until the passport expires.



Duration of the mobility period




- The duration of the mobility is set out in the bilateral Agreement
- **Minimum duration of** 2 months **maximum of** 12 months



- <u>Early return</u> is possible after the **minimum duration** of 60 days
- An extension of the period is possible (within the maximum eligible duration per study cycle)
- Funding for the extended period is at the moment not guaranteed!
- The duration of the mobility, *including possible extension*, cannot exceed 12 months
- Holiday breaks at the Host University do not count as the interruption of the mobility period

What can I do in Erasmus?





IMPORTANT: You MUST be enrolled at UniTO for the academic year 2025/2026 to carry out your mobility.

- > Academic activities abroad must be **coherent** with the study area of the bilateral agreement
- > Full academic recognition by signing a **Learning Agreement** (study plan for your activities abroad)
- Before you start working on your Learning Agreement read this document carefully: <u>Guidelines</u>
 <u>for recognising study activities abroad</u> published on UniTO portal



If the Partner Institution does not approve your study plan for your activities abroad, they will not be recognised!

You have to verify well in advance the availability to validate traineeship or research activities.

You must apply according to the Main Department under which your degree programme is offered:

- Main Department is associated to a "School": you can choose a destination amongst all the ones offered by the Departments associated to that School
- Main Department is not associated to any "School": you can only choose destinations offered by your Main Department



Linguistic Requirements: Passaporto per l'Europa



Students who are WINNERS (not candidates) of the Erasmus+ Mobility Call for Studies are entitled to participate in an exam session to obtain the linguistic certification Passaporto per l'Europa.

- ✓ Attestation of one's level of competence (not a certificate!) in the foreign or vehicular language of the mobility destination country – in collaboration with the University Language Center – CLA.

4. Nominations and departures







ATTENTION!

Annually, the Partner Universities define deadlines for the receipt of names (*nomination*) and admission (*application*) of Erasmus mobility winners.

If the above deadlines are prior to the conclusion of the selection process of the University of Turin, departure in the 1st semester of the a.y. 2025/2026 is **NOT guaranteed** and it will be necessary to consider a possible departure in the 2nd semester, regardless of the number of months provided by the destination.

PROGRAMME COUNTRIES, UNITED KINGDOM AND SWITZERLAND destinations

potentially affected by earlier nomination deadlines are noted with the following wording: "Sulla base della scadenza Nomination prevista dall'Ateneo partner, l'avvio della mobilità nel primo semestre non è garantito."

That means that **Based on the Nomination deadline** scheduled by the host university, the start of mobility in the 1st semester is not guaranteed.

For mobility to **PARTNER COUNTRIES**, each applicant is required to independently check the nomination deadlines and application requirements (application for admission) directly with the host University by consulting the website.

All students are encouraged to check these deadlines on the Partner University website.





Scores and selection

 - A1) Weighted average of grades: max 35 points
 - A2) Number of credits recorded: max 35 points
- **B.** Additional score max 30 points:

Awarded by the Evaluation Committee of each School/Department based on the selection criteria set out in Annex I of the Call.

Should there be more than one student with an equal score, priority will be given to the one who has been enrolled at UniTO the longest (not considering students behind with their exams — "fuori corso") and eventually, to the youngest candidate.

Phase 1 Evaluation and scoring of applications starting from mid- February 2025 At this stage, it is only possible to check the score obtained for each selected destination of consulting the MyUnito personal page. In case of exclusion, the personal page also shows the real exclusion given by the Evaluation Committee. No acceptance is required from the candidates.		
Phase 2 Requests for review	Should the student find any anomalies in the outcome of their application, they can submit a request for it to be reviewed. Students can only apply for a review for one or both of the following reasons: • incorrect attribution of additional score; • incorrect exclusion. Requests have to be submitted (though Google Form) within 3 calendar days from the publishing of the temporary ranking list and they will be reviewed by a Committee within the School/Department.

Phase 5 Reallocating students	After Phase 4, eligible students not yet assigned will be transferred to destinations with places made available by students refusing or failing to accept their destination. Those who still don't have a position could be assigned in destinations left vacant following the Evaluation Committee procedures. Reallocating students can be done by a public Call or an official assignment in two different ways: A. Reallocating by single ranking: Eligible candidates are placed in a single ranking based on their highest score and destinations available are assigned in descending order of score (see Annex I) B. Reallocation by language (English, French, German, Portuguese, Spanish and any other language) Different rankings are drawn up based on languages related to students' preferences. (see Annex I) During this phase students can be assigned to any destination with available slots and not necessarly to the destinations selected in their application
Phase 6 2nd Final Ranking Starting from mid-April 2025	Publication of final ranking list.
Phase 7 Accepting/refusing the mobility	Students must accept or refuse the Erasmus+ destination which they have been selected for within 5 calendar days from the publishing of the list.
