

Who can apply?



The University of Torino guarantees access to the Erasmus+ programme to all students if they are regularly enrolled (including part-time) in a:



Implementation of the Erasmus+ Program is largely decentralized: the European Commission entrusts budget implementation functions to the National Agencies

Study in the UK





From 1st October 2021 EU/EEA students from EU countries will need a **valid passport** to enter the UK and won't be permitted to travel using an ID card.

Students with passports other than British or Irish who intend to spend a period of mobility in the UK for a period **longer than 6 months** must apply for **Student Visa** <u>Student visa - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk)</u>

The current fee for a Student Visa is £363 plus an NHS health surcharge of £470. This will provide the students with NHS access for the duration of their programme.


Students with **Italian passports** who intend to spend a period of mobility in the UK for **a period of less than 6 months** to date **do not need to apply for a visa** but will need to provide specific documentation upon arrival.

Duration of the mobility period




- The duration of the mobility is set out in the bilateral Agreement
- **Minimum duration of** 2 months **maximum of** 12 months



- <u>Early return</u> is possible after the **minimum duration** of 60 days
- An extension of the period is possible (within the maximum eligible duration per study cycle)
- Funding for the extended period is at the moment not guaranteed!
- The duration of the mobility, *including possible extension*, cannot exceed 12 months
- Holiday breaks at the Host University do not count as the interruption of the mobility period

What can I do in Erasmus?





IMPORTANT: You MUST be enrolled at UniTO for the academic year 2024/2025 to carry out your mobility.

- > Full academic recognition by signing a **Learning Agreement** (study plan for your activities abroad)
- Before you start working on your Learning Agreement read this document carefully: <u>Guidelines</u>
 <u>for recognising study activities abroad</u> published on UniTO portal



If the Partner Institution does not approve your study plan for your activities abroad, they will not be recognised!

You have to verify well in advance the availability to validate traineeship or research activities.

4. Erasmus+ Travel Contribution TYPE 2: TOP UP Travel Green



Travel grant intended for Erasmus Studio mobility beneficiaries a.y. 2023/2024 who will undertake a **green** trip in order to reach their destination and who do not receive "TRAVEL GRANT" grants (type 1).

The Travel Green TOP UP fund is for travelling distances up to 4,000 km:

- travel fund of a one-off payment equal to €50.00 (NO variable amounts based on distance);
- a daily allowance depending on the monthly scholarship (PART A/30 days + any PART B/30 days = daily amount due). This allowance is recognised for each day of environmentally friendly travel (in both directions) in order to reach the destination and for a maximum of 4 day.

Il **TOP UP Travel Green** will be paid after presenting **supporting evidence** of the actual environmentally friendly travel and time needed to reach the destination.



4. Nominations and departures







ATTENTION!

Annually, the Partner Universities define deadlines for the receipt of names (*nomination*) and admission (*application*) of Erasmus mobility winners.

If the above deadlines are prior to the conclusion of the selection process of the University of Turin, departure in the 1st semester of the a.y. 2024/2025 is **NOT guaranteed** and it will be necessary to consider a possible departure in the 2nd semester, regardless of the number of months provided by the destination.

PROGRAMME COUNTRIES, UNITED KINGDOM AND SWITZERLAND destinations

potentially affected by earlier nomination deadlines are noted with the following wording: "Sulla base della scadenza Nomination prevista dall'Ateneo partner, l'avvio della mobilità nel primo semestre non è garantito."

That means that **Based on the Nomination deadline**scheduled by the host university, the start of mobility in
the 1st semester is not guaranteed.

For mobility to **PARTNER COUNTRIES**, each applicant is required to independently check the nomination deadlines and application requirements (application for admission) directly with the host University by consulting the website.

All students are encouraged to check these deadlines on the Partner University website.

Awarded by the Evaluation Committee of each School/Department based on the selection criteria set out in Annex I of the Call.

Should there be more than one student with an equal score, priority will be given to the one who has been enrolled at UniTO the longest (not considering students behind with their exams — "fuori corso") and eventually, to the youngest candidate.

Those who still don't have a position could be assigned in destinations left vacant following the Evaluation Committee procedures. Reallocating students can be done by a public Call or an official assignment in two different ways: A. Reallocating by single ranking: Eligible candidates are placed in a single ranking based on their highest score and destinations available are assigned in descending order of score B. Reallocation by language (English, French, German, Portuguese, Spanish and any other language) Different rankings are drawn up based on languages related to students' preferences. During this phase students can be assigned to any destination with available slots and not necessarly to the destinations selected in their application.
