3 May | **Introduction to Intellectual Property**

This session covers the basics of intellectual property. What are the different types of IP and why are they important

10 May | **Innovation and Innovative Thinking**

This session covers ideation, brainstorming and bringing your ideas to life.

17 May | **Licensing, R&D Collaboration, Spin-outs**

This session covers different ways of realising your idea using real-life examples such as when ideas from universities are brought to market through collaboration with industry (licensing) or by creating a spin-out company.

24 May | **Research, Impact and Engagement**

This session will explain how you can build impact into your research project and how you can communicate it. There will be a focus on engaging the university's external stakeholders to achieve this.

31 May | **Grant Writing and Funding**

In this session, experts will describe how to get funding for developing your idea. Both European and national funding will be covered.

7 June | **Launching a Start-up Company**

In this session, founders of three diverse university spin-outs will describe their journey and how starting a company helped them achieve impact.

12 June | **Designing an Impact and Commercial Pathway**

During this in-person workshop, participants will be invited to apply the knowledge they have gained through the series to their own project.
