Civil society has been one of the motors of the Green Transition. Environmental NGOs and movements have been at the forefront of raising awareness regarding the necessity to abandon fossil fuels and embrace sustainable development. However, the swift transition to a climate-neutral economy by 2050, as envisioned by the European Green Deal, requires a comprehensive overhaul of industrial, economic, labour and social policies and entails significant distributive effects. Thus, the policies behind the Green Transition are also liable to trigger a backlash, as it is already occurring in several Member States where the implementation of the Green Deal has become a political battleground. This Spring School wants to examine the EU path toward the Green Transition through the lens of civic engagement, by analysing the actors that support or oppose environmental policies and how the EU political and judicial institutions mediate their ability to mobilize. The Turin Spring School, organised by the Law Department of the University of Turin (Hub 3 - Environment and Climate Change), will address this topical issue through a combination of lectures and workshops.
