Current Research interests

The current research of Dr. Boano focuses on two main fields: scientific research on archaeological human remains (paleobiological and paleopathological studies) and Museum practice (conservation, collecting and displaying human remains).

She gained her PhD at the University of Florence working on skeletal malformation in ancient human remains.

She collaborates with the Section of Pathological Anatomy and Histology (DICMI), University of Genoa (Prof. Ezio Fulcheri) on osteological pathology, macroscopic and microscopic tissue degradation. She contributed in realizing protocols and methods to optimize the preservation of ancient biological collections.

She also collaborates with the laboratory of Anthropology of the University of Marseille (France), Faculty of Medicine, under the supervision of Prof. G. Boetsch (CNRS), working on current trends and future possibilities in the collecting of human bones.

Dr. Boano is the author of 60 publications.

Other experiences

From 1997, Dr. Boano collaborated to realize temporary exhibitions in the Anthropological and Ethnological Museum of Turin.

From 1998, she collaborated with the Egyptian Museum in Turin, Archaeological Superintendences and other local Museums for anthropological, paleopathological and conservative studies.

From 2004 she became the scientific expert in the canonic recognition of holy bodies.
