ANDREA PELLIZZARI, born in Alessandria (Italy), on January 20th, 1966.

1) LINES OF ACADEMIC CAREER, TEACHING POSITIONS AND INSTITUTIONAL CHARGES

- He graduated in Lettere (Humanities) in 1992 at the University of Turin with a Dissertation on a Roman History subject (thesis supervisor: prof. Lellia Cracco Ruggini), magna cum laude.
 - He attended to his PhD (1992-1995) in Storia Antica. Storia politica e culturale dell'Antichità classica (Ancient History. Political and Cultural History of the Classical Antiquity), cycle VIII, at the University of Florence and then received the Italian academic title of "dottore di ricerca" (Diss.: Commento storico al terzo libro dell'epistolario di Q. Aurelio Simmaco).
 - From 1993 to 2008 he carried on an intense assistantship activity nearby the chair of Roman History (Prof. Lellia Cracco Ruggini and Sergio Roda, University of Turin).
 - Under the tutorship of Prof. Paolo Desideri (University of Florence), he obtained a postdoctoral rewarded scholarship in Ancient History at the University of Florence (1999-2001).
 - From 2000 to 2008 he was teacher of literary subjects, Latin and Greek at the state high school "Liceo G. Peano" of Tortona (AL), Italy.
 - In October 2008 he obtained a permanent tenure track as a "Ricercatore" (Lecturer), in Roman History, at Facoltà di Lettere e Filosofia (Faculty of Letters and Philosophy), University of Turin.
 - In 2014 he obtained the "Habilitation" as Professore Associato (Associate Professor), in Ancient History (Roman History) in the National Selection (ASN).
 - In 2018 he obtained the "Habilitation" as Professore Ordinario (Full Professor), in Ancient History (Roman History), in the National Selection (ASN).
 - In 2019 he obtained the permanent position of Associate Professor in Roman History (University of Turin, May 2019).

- Since the academic year 2008-2009 and up to date he has regularly taught courses in Roman history first at the Facoltà di Lettere e Filosofia (Faculty of Letters and Philosophy), then at the Scuola di Scienze Umanistiche (School of Humanities) of the University of Turin. To these must be added the teachings of Latin Epigraphy (academic year 2008-2009), Exegesis of the sources of Roman History (from academic year 2009-2010 to 2011-2012), History of Late Antiquity (from academic year 2018-2019 to present).

- During these years, in addition to the regular scheduled teaching activity, he has been supervisor of numerous degree theses and has participated in all the institutional activities and all the official committees of various kinds to which he was appointed by his University. Among these:
 - The membership of the Board of the Department of History (Giunta, Dipartimento di Storia, University of Turin), from 2009 to 2011;
 - The membership of the academic Board of teachers of the PhD in Scienze archeologiche, Storiche e Storico-artistiche (Archaeological, Historical and Historical-Artistic Sciences) at the University of Turin (from 2017 to present), on whose behalf he has been tutor of some doctoral thesis and, in 2019, component of the selection Committee for admission to the XXXV cycle.

- He has been also a component of selection boards for public university competitions in Italy and abroad:
 - April-May 2013: component of the Selection Committee for a position of Maître de Conférences at the École Normale Supérieure de Lyon.
 - September 2019-January 2020: component of the selection Committee for a fixed-term tenure track as "Ricercatore" (Lecturer) at the University of Florence (Roman History).

2) INTERNATIONAL ACTIVITIES

International Scholarships

- July 1996: He was holder of a scholarship provided by the Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs in collaboration with the ÖAD (Österreichischer Akademischer Austauschdienst [Austrian Academic Exchange Service]) at the Institut für klassische Philologie (Institute of Classical Philology) of the University of Innsbruck.

Affairs in collaboration with the the DAAD (Deutscher Akademischer Austauschdienst [German Academic Exchange Service]) at the Seminar für Alte Geschichte (Ancient History Seminar) of the University of Bonn.

3) TOPICS OF RESEARCH

- Political and cultural history of Late Antiquity, with particular attention to the exegesis of historical-literary sources (Servius' Commentarii in Vergilii Carmina and the epistolaries of Symmachus and Libanius);
- Reconstruction of the relationships between centre and periphery, imperial power and local aristocracies between East and West through the prosopographical study of the recipients of late antique letter collections;
- Political and cultural history of the late antique Near East;
- Schooling, Education and greek-latin Bilingualism in Late Antiquity;
- Celebration of the late antique city model through epigraphic and literary documentation;
- Relations between Christianity and Paganism, with particular reference to the re-reading of some late antique sources as the Consultationes Zacchei et Apollonii (IV century AD);
- Urban topography of late antique Constantinople through late antique and Byzantine historiographic and literary evidence;
- Reception of the Greco-Roman world in modern and contemporary culture and history, with particular reference to the rhetoric of Romanity in the Italian parliamentary debate and in the Italian journalism in the age of the pre-fascist colonialism (1880-1920) and to the World War I as a crucial experience in the historiographic reflection.

4) PARTICIPATION IN NATIONAL AND INTERNATIONAL RESEARCH PROJECTS

- He has been a component of a local research unit (University of Turin) for the program PRIN over the years 1998 [1999-2000] (Director: prof. Paolo Desideri); 2000 [2001-2002] (Director: prof. Paolo Desideri); 2005 [2006-2007] (Director: prof. Paolo Desideri); 2009 [2010-2011] (Director: Prof. Giovannella Cresci Marrone) and of other local research projects (University of Turin) over the years 2009, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2015, 2018, 2019, 2021.

- Since February 2011 to present: he collaborates with CEROR (Centre d'Études et de Recherche sur l'Occident romain [Centre for Study and Research on the Roman West]) at the Université Lyon III (Director: prof. B. Cabouret) aimed at the translation, the historical commentary and the online dissemination of the letters collection of Libanius.

5) PARTICIPATION IN NATIONAL AND INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCES

- He has held lectures at many national and international conferences, masters, PhD, Tables-Rondes, university courses and advanced training seminars in Italy (Universities of Milan "Statale", Rome [Roma Tre e Università di Roma "La Sapienza"], Florence, Siena, Perugia, Naples, Parma, Bologna, Verona), and abroad (Université Jean Moulin, Lyon III; Université Lumière, Lyon II; Université Saint-Denis, Paris VIII; University of Edinburgh). He has also organized and held lectures in two Doctoral Seminars at the University of Turin: La costruzione identitaria dell'impero romano d'Oriente (April 2016); Epistolografia pubblica e privata nell'impero romano d'Oriente (February 2018).
