

Massimo Cuono is Associate Professor at the Department of Culture, Politics and Society (University of Turin), where he teaches Political Philosophy. His main research interests concern: political representation and imaginaries of disintermediation in modern and contemporary thought, arbitrary and discretionary power, rationality and reasonableness in the law; on these topics he published scientific papers in Italian, English, French, and Spanish.

He is managing editor of the scientific journal "Teoria politica" (available soon on the platform revues.org), scientific coordinator of "Biennale Democrazia", member of the executive board of the "Unione culturale Franco Antonicelli" and of the "Osservatorio sulla Comunicazione Politica e Pubblica".

He holds a MA in Philosophy (University La Sapienza, Rome) and a fully funded PhD in Political Studies (University of Turin); he has been visiting scholar at the New School for Social Research (New York) and he spent 12 months at the Sorbonne University (Paris) with an Erasmus scholarship. He has been Research Fellow at the Universities of Sassari, Torino and Bergamo.

He taught "Politics e Technology" with Juan Carlos De Martin at the Politecnico di Torino (2021-2023), at the Master Program in "Global Rule of Law and Constitutional Democracy" (University of Genova, 2012-2016), in the Master Program in "Analyse comparée des sociétés méditerranéennes" (University Mohammed VI Polytechnique, Rabat, 2014-2016), and at the MA and BA level at the University of Piemonte Orientale (2015-2018).
